Kade Matthew Meyer was a happy and healthy 2nd grader at Madison Elementary when he died tragically at the age of 7 on September 2, 2010. This scholarship is dedicated to his memory and is intended to honor graduates whose parent(s) is an employee of USD 231. The scholarship will be presented annually through the Class of 2021, Kade's graduation year.

ELIGIBILITY & REQUIREMENTS (must meet all criteria listed below)

1. GEHS graduating senior (AEC students are not eligible)
2. Attended GEHS 2 or more years including entire Senior year
3. Minimum cumulative 3.0 GPA
4. Be in good standing as it relates to discipline and attendance
5. Child of current USD 231 employee (employment minimum of 1 year)

2. At the end of 1st grade, Kade was given the Compassion Award for his class and after his death his family learned of multiple acts that supported his distinction. Share at least 1 specific example of how you have been compassionate towards another GEHS student(s).
